The Foundation offers a variety of adaptive sports, recreation, and enrichment programs that help children with physical disabilities stay active, build confidence, and connect with peers. Year-round opportunities include adaptive sports, outdoor recreation, creative activities, sensory-friendly events, and STEM programs designed to be inclusive, accessible, and fun.

In 2026, we're expanding community partnerships to offer additional program options. Some programs may have limited availability or participation fees, so early registration is encouraged to improve the chance of securing a spot and requesting financial assistance if needed.

After submitting the required 2026 participation form, families will receive monthly program schedules and a short online form to select which activities they plan to attend and how many family members will join.
